Tim,

First, I needed to make all Board members aware of a bus incident today. An early childhood student was left on the bus after the driver parked the bus in the Sundling lot after his route today. The young boy went undetected on the bus. The driver failed to follow procedures, and state law, by checking the bus before leaving it.

The child left the bus shortly after the driver left it parked in the lot. A couple of mechanics saw the boy and brought him to the transportation office. He was taken back to CLA pretty calm through the whole process. We have spoken to the parents to let them know what transpired.

As for follow-up with the driver, the tape from the bus has been reviewed, and the driver will be allowed his due process. Based on the findings, termination may be recommended. I will keep you posted on the outcome of this event.

Regarding your question about the emails. We collected all the emails pertaining to the FOIA request and sent them to Mike Loizzi for review. His office used black marker to redact any information that was exempt, and withheld emails for specific reasons. The letter explaining both the redactions and withholdings is attached to this email. We forwarded the email pages on to the person making the request (electronically.)

If you have emails that you feel should have been released, please forward them either to me or Mike Loizzi. We want to be in full compliance with the FOIA request.

As far as the electricity contract, because the board asked for us to do an RFP, there are posting requirements (in the newspaper) and other required steps that we are taking to secure the information. I should have suggested that we simply ask for quotes from the two companies that bid the last contract. That process would have been much simpler and quicker. I will let you know when the RFP process is complete.
